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### PARLA



Currently, Parla is among the 50 most populated cities in Spain and, with more than 125,000 inhabitants, in demographic terms, can be compared to a large majority of provincial capitals of the Spanish State. The city has undergone notable changes in recent years, in which it has carried out the implementation of important projects and infrastructure, the increase of public services and the new model of citizen relationship, enhanced through a real bet of approach to the

neighbours.

In April 2006, the Madrid Assembly approved the inclusion of Parla in the Large Cities Act.



### DEMOGRAPHY

At the beginning of the 20th century, Parla had a population of 1238 inhabitants. This population grew throughout the 20th century to the more than 120,000 inhabitants it had in November 2012.





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The demographic expansion occurred at the end of the 1960s due to the migratory movements that were taking place in Spain. Between the 1960s and the 1970s, the population grew by 470%, from 1809 inhabitants to 10,317.

Parla suffers a large population growth during the 1970s, in the context of a demographic expansion of the country, where rural populations migrated to large cities in search of prosperity and work. Almost a million people emigrated from Castilla la Mancha, Andalusia and Extremadura to Madrid, occupying the towns of the metropolitan crown, as a result of the price of housing and road communications.

Since the 1980s, a total of 50,000 inhabitants were counted, 26 times more than at the beginning of the 1960s. Growth remained constant from the 1980s until the 1990s, when this growth began to stabilize. Between the years 1991 and 1996 there was a reduction in the growth of the population of the province. Since 1996, this trend has changed and a new demographic growth is beginning that lasts today. This growth is due to the arrival of people from Madrid, from municipalities near Parla. This new demographic growth brings new immigration from abroad, especially from Algeria, Morocco, Poland and sub-Saharan Africa.



### SOCIO-ECONOMIC DATA



The primary sector begins to be marginal, with an agrarian surface dedicated almost exclusively to tillage. The cause of this situation of marginality is due, among other important reasons, to the high urban pressure suffered by the municipality, which is rapidly subtracting agricultural land.

The employed population in the secondary or industrial sector accounts for 27.5% of the total, concentrated in industrial machinery, food and other manufacturing industries. The start-up of the Business Park has been a boost to these areas, at the expense of







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the destruction of the natural environment, in which numerous animal and plant species are concentrated, as well as irreplaceable habitats (seasonal lagoons and streams, olive groves and cereal steppes). .

Within the services sector, retail, personal services and public administration stand out. It should be noted that trade and catering, represent 3/5 of the productive fabric of Parla and is composed almost entirely by small and medium enterprises. In Parla, the per capita income amounts to € 19,028.83.

In November 2010 the data is given by the delegate of the Government and Mayor of Parla, which is 19 points above the Community of Madrid average in citizen security.
